The I-COUNT system administration staff utilizes a multi faceted approach to maintain and improve data quality. This approach begins with comprehensive training and follow up. Two local trainings are held in our training lab each month and participants are required to successfully complete a data entry comprehension test in order to have their user license activated on the network. Next telephone and in person assistance is readily available to resolve data entry questions. Finally, each month all participating providers are monitored through a network report on their data entry completeness and quality and this report is published to the entire network. This is known as the I-COUNT HMIS All Stars. It has proved to be highly effective in motivating agency administration to give attention to their HMIS participation and data quality. Any agency that is identified to have ongoing problems with their data entry quality is contacted personally by an HMIS system administrator in order to determine the barriers that the agency is experiencing that prevents quality data entry and a process is identified to resolve the issues.

The data collection survey was finalized through a cooperative planning effort with representatives from all Iowa continua. Once the survey was completed, the required report was built in HMIS system and a paper survey instrument was produced for any agencies not entering data into the HMIS network. Next a training was held via the state wide Iowa Communications Network on how to produce the PIT report through our HMIS network and also how to accurately complete the paper survey if that was needed. All agencies turned in their PIT reports to the HMIS lead agency and the results were tabulated. HMIS staff followed up with any agency that produced a report with obvious errors and also follow up was done with any agency that did not turn in a report. Our point in time data showed a 7% increase in the number of person in shelters from 2007 to 2008. We believe that this difference is most likely due to the improved methods and process for the point in time data collection.

The automated HMIS report built into the network, calculated subpopulation data for all clients. This report was run by provider agencies and they were required to verify the information and return the summary report to the HMIS system administration staff. Agencies not collecting data on the HMIS network were instructed on how to accurately calculate their subpopulation data for their current clients and turned in a paper summary survey of data. This information was then tabulated finalized by HMIS administration staff. In 2008, while the overall number of sheltered homeless persons increased on the point in time day (1824 vs 1340), the number of chronically homeless persons decreased. We believe that this result is a combination of having a more effective data quality and follow up process from previous years as well as some new shelter beds reporting. We believe that the chronic homeless count may well have declined due to the development of additional beds targeted to this population and a more targeted outreach to this population.

The count of unsheltered persons was conducted on the day of the point in time and done by scattered survey teams assigned to targeted geographic locations within a specifically condensed time period in order to reduce the likelihood of duplication. The count was conducted by trained survey teams led by professional outreach workers assisted by local law enforcement officers. Survey data was compared to longitudinal HMIS data entry done by street outreach programs serving areas in the Balance of State to both verify accuracy and also to eliminate any possible duplication of persons that could potentially occur.

The Iowa Council on Homelessness Continuum of Care Committee is working with local and regional continuua to identify areas of greatest need. Local efforts include regular meetings of shelter and support service providers to share and coordinate information and resources and expanded use of InfoLink, the local 211 resource information line. Outreach efforts include linking agencies and services in the community such as hospitals, mental health facilities, Salvation Army, Police Dept., local churches and food pantries to insure referrals are made promptly to appropriate services. Statewide, to improve access to the available resources we have created a vast database and website that will help locate rental housing or homes for sale in the state. See HousingInIowa.org.

Each regional and local continuum of care planning body within the Balance of State develops locally appropriate strategies for engagement of unsheltered homeless persons. These methods include, but are not limited to; direct street engagement, contacts through meal sites and food/supply pantry service sites. In addition the Iowa State Department of Public Safety (in coordination with the Iowa Council on Homelessness) directs state, county and community law enforcement personnel to identify, engage and report on unsheltered homeless persons encountered in rural and remote areas of the State. The number of unsheltered persons counted during the point in time decreased slightly (just over 1%). This is likely due to the fact that the point in time was done on an exceptionally cold day in January (single digit temperatures) in Iowa. As you might expect when temperatures drop, folks living out who would ordinarily not use shelters, will come in to escape the cold. It is also probable that the increase in beds for the chronically homeless (often represented in our unsheltered population) could have made an impact as well.

In response to the discharge policy developed by the Iowa Council on Homelessness, the Iowa Department of Corrections (DOC) established a new Discharge Planning Coordinator position and implemented a comprehensive reentry case management system that is improving offender outcomes when they are released. Some of the elements include beginning to plan for release when offenders are admitted at the Iowa Medical and Classification Center (IMCC); completing a battery of assessments during reception to identify risk and needs that will be used at the next institution to develop a case management plan; identifying a targeted release date that will be used to prioritize treatment programming that addresses risk and needs; contacting Community Based Corrections (CBC) when an offender is within six months of that targeted release date to begin engaging CBC staff in a dialogue to plan for the offenders release; another contact with CBC when the offender is within two months of the targeted release date to create a solid release plan so that when the offender is granted release by the Board of Parole (BOP) the offender is prepared for release, CBC is prepared to assume supervision and the offender walks out the prison door within a few days after the release decision is made. The case plan does focus on housing as well as treatment issues. The goal is to have appropriate housing arranged prior to release so that the likelihood of homelessness is reduced.
